

Royal Inca Tour

For thousands of visitors the spectacular Machu Picchu is a highlight of their trip to Peru. Many of those reach this Inca sanctuary on foot after trekking for days through the Andean highlands. At HighLives, we have discovered an alternative path to Machu Picchu that approaches the site via a less-trodden ancient trail through the hills and valleys of the Cordillera Vilcabamba. Escorted by experienced guides and with mules to carry bags, you will trek from lodge to lodge, traversing magnificent mountain passes between snow-capped peaks with rarely seen views of Machu Picchu.



Day-by-day

Days 1-3: Leave Cusco to travel towards Soraypampa via the Inca ruins of Tarawasi and the mountain village of Mollepata. Trek up to Soraypampa on an old route called the "Camino Real". Go for a dip in a glacial lake.

Days 8: Explore the fascinating and mysterious Machu Picchu set beautifully in the middle of a tropical mountain forest. Head back to Cusco.


